
As a bonus, Phoenix says she's coming too so she can give you some love and comfort as well.

IN LOVING MEMORY OF EVELYN CHIDESTER

Evelyn Chidester passed away peacefully on June 1 at the age of 100. Ev was born in Cleveland on April Fool's Day 1925. Perhaps due to this auspicious holiday she did not suffer fools lightly.

Born to parents Irene (Frey) and Harry Parry she later became older sister to
Dan and Marian. Ev's childhood was not easy, disrupted by the Great Depression. She said
that the Cleveland Public Library saved her life. She learned to read at the age of four.
Books, writing, and education were a life-long refuge. She wrote poems and short stories
reflecting her life. If an event happened you could count on reading about it.

Ev met her intellectual equal and partner of forty-seven years, Franklyn Chidester, at the University of Chicago where they were pursuing advanced degrees. She obtained a Bachelor of A rts in mathematics and a Master of Arts in political science, industrial relations. Ev and Frank loved each other deeply and enjoyed each other's company with laughter, scrabble, honeymoon bridge, bicycling and classical music. They raised four daughters in the shadow of the University of Chicago on the Southside, Leslie Shulhafer (Rocky), Liza Bullock (Tom), Ellen Whalen (Kevin) and Kate Chidester (Graham Dobson). Ev is survived by her daughters and eight grandchildren, Sarah (Randy), Lynne, David (Katie), Jane, Diana (Sam), Emma (Ian), Madelaine, Glynndon (Brita) and great grandchildren Georgia and Lucas. She is predeceased by her first-born son Paul Allyn who died in infancy, a heartbreak never mended. Ev was predeceased by Frank who passed away in 1995. Happily, the girls and many grandchildren gathered for Ev's 100th birthday.

Ev was a city girl. She loved her Public Cleveland High School, Glenville, and attended most annual reunions. After many years in Chicago Ev and Frank made a short move to Barrington, Rhode Island followed by many years in Tarrytown, New York where New York City and the Hudson Valley captivated with the annual Film festival, Broadway, Opera, and a fulfilling career as Executive Director of the Home Health Care Program at Yonkers Family Service, where she made a difference in people's lives.

Upon retirement Ev, Frank and Frank's mother Helen moved to Cincinnati to be near Liza and Tom. Here Ev found friends and fellowship at the Northern Hills Unitarian Fellowship. She happily went to 'church' with her Jewish, Catholic and Buddhist friends where her atheism and intellect were appreciated. Her last move was back to Chicago to live with Leslie where she was able to walk freely outside during the Pandemic. She spent her final years in the care of the team at Northbrook Inn to whom the family is grateful for their compassion, knowledge, and skill.

Evelyn will be privately interred at the family plot in Canton Ohio alongside Paul and Frank. Memorial donations can be made to Planned Parenthood or the ACLU.



Ways to give to GNH

GNH is grateful for all those who have kept up with their pledges during the pandemic and days of virtual services.

As you know, there are several ways to give of your financial resources to GNH:

- Mail a check to GNH.
- Ask your bank or credit union to mail a monthly check automatically. Many banks do not charge fees for this service. Check with your bank.
- Set up monthly or quarterly automatic payments from your investment accounts. Talk to your financial adviser.
- Use our online giving app, Givelify. Set up your personal confidential account at https://giv.li/phv85g. Download the Givelify app to your smartphone using the Apple Store or Google Play. Once you have the app, donating to GNH is as easy as Tap. Give. Done. (Note that Givelify charges GNH a transaction fee of 2.9% on each transaction, so you may want to increase your online donation by a small percentage to compensate.)

NEWSLETTER POLICY (September 2008)

All items that appear in the Harbinger should be of general interest to the members and friends of GNH and be consistent with GNH's mission, purposes, and policies.

Newsletter submission should be as brief as possible, with a 500 word maximum. The editor has the right and responsibility to edit as needed to ensure conciseness and readability. The editor also has the right to delay publishing non-time-critical articles as available space may require.

The newsletter editor may refuse publication if a submission is considered inappropriate.

The editor shall consult with the minister and the Trustee who holds the communication portfolio for guidance in what shall be published.

Members of GNH shall have the choice to receive the Harbinger electronically or via paper mail. The newsletter shall be posted on the website. Do not submit names or contact information without the consent of other persons.
