Konsious Konscience

Hello GNH members and friends,

I had wanted a recurring space for sharing ideas arising in my various spiritual endeavors--a "cognitive staging area" for messages and discussions amongst us. The Service Planning Team will use the space to solicit ideas and keep you abreast of efforts. Michael is known for his skill to reach into his mind and pull out "what's been on there", making for great discussion material. So without any specific promised pattern of recurrence, we offer this space for articles such as these.

This can also include writings by any of our members and friends. Perhaps you have profound ideas to share but feel more comfortable publishing in written form rather than delivering by speaking. Here's the venue! It's an experiment in mindful creativity for generating good worship space. Even the title is experimental (do YOU understand what the current one means?) and will likely change from issue to issue. What will be constant is the hope that it inspires and uplifts and grounds our community in its shared worship space. And now on to some musings. In the Lakota tradition of the sweat lodge there are tiny sacred pouches of tobacco strung around the interior of the lodge. The tobacco plant invokes the union of Father Sky and Mother Earth and the prayers that come through us native creatures inhabiting that space. The tobacco holds these prayers as they form during the lodge. Through tobacco-soaked sweat running into the soil and through the smoke of its combustion wafting into the air, the prayers are presented back to the Mother and Father as a sacred offering. It is instructive to imagine ourselves exhibiting that degree of deliberate care and reflective tending with all of the words we speak and all of the ways we engage. Indeed one of the prayer ties always strung before a lodge are the white and black pouches, fifteen each, for Right Ways and Words.

This is what we do in a Sunday Worship Service with the songs, gongs, quotes and quips: we are setting the stage, establishing an intention and raising resonant energy to support the capacity of the message we receive to transform us. The entire service we do to hold up the proper intention and energy for our lives throughout the week. These implicit rituals in our lives, like the words in our messages, all serve to keep us strong in our beliefs so that we may live well and love.

A matter of right ways and words has been on my mind concerning ideation about the "end of things" and apocalyptic fixations: what do they mean? how do we survive them? Coming up in September (14th & 21st) I'm delivering a two-part message series. Right Ways & Words **Part One: "Ontocalypse Now"** will consider significant revelations that life sometimes brings us that so completely undermine our usual basic assumptions and beliefs that it throws us for a loop. We will discover what might be the most shocking revelation to end all such revelations. **Part Two: "A Place at Our Table"** offers some thoughts on how that ultimate revelation can guide us in transforming those in our

We arrive at the Lighthouse at 11:30 and serve at noon. Contact Cheryl if anyone wants to donate food.



Ways to give to GNH

GNH is grateful for all those who have kept up with their pledges during the pandemic and days of virtual services.

As you know, there are several ways to give of your financial resources to GNH:

- Mail a check to GNH.
- Ask your bank or credit union to mail a monthly check automatically. Many banks do not charge fees for this service. Check with your bank.
- Set up monthly or quarterly automatic payments from your investment accounts. Talk to your financial adviser.
- Use our online giving app, Givelify. Set up your personal confidential account at https://giv.li/phv85g. Download the Givelify app to your smartphone using the Apple Store or Google Play. Once you have the app, donating to GNH is as easy as Tap. Give. Done. (Note that Givelify charges GNH a transaction fee of 2.9% on each transaction, so you may want to increase your online donation by a small percentage to compensate.)

NEWSLETTER POLICY (September 2008)

All items that appear in the Harbinger should be of general interest to the members and friends of GNH and be consistent with GNH's mission, purposes, and policies.

Newsletter submission should be as brief as possible, with a 500 word maximum. The editor has the right and responsibility to edit as needed to ensure conciseness and readability. The editor also has the right to delay publishing non-time-critical articles as available space may require.

The newsletter editor may refuse publication if a submission is considered inappropriate.

The editor shall consult with the minister and the Trustee who holds the communication portfolio for guidance in what shall be published.

Members of GNH shall have the choice to receive the Harbinger electronically or via paper mail. The newsletter shall be posted on the website. Do not submit names or contact information without the consent of other persons.
