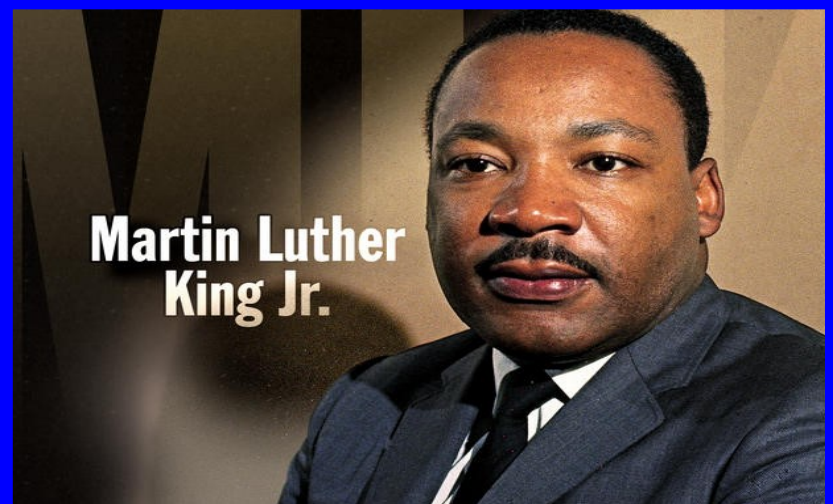

Found House IHN Requests Donations

Found House Interfaith Housing Network provides emergency shelter and housing programs for homeless families in Cincinnati and the surrounding areas. For 30 years, the Interfaith Hospitality Network worked with local churches, who each provided temporary housing and meals for a week at a time to four needy families. **The Gathering** and **GNH** partnered with several other churches, most recently Friendship UMC and Christ Church Glendale, to bring meals and evening recreation to the families that were temporarily housed in those churches.

Found House has now centralized its temporary housing program and no longer depends on churches to provide temporary bedrooms on a weekly basis, but they still need the support of churches and individuals to provide food, pet and human shelter expenses, education, and other help for supporting permanent solution to housing insecurity. Meeting the New Year

A story by Tim Atkins and an invitation...*

New Year's is my favorite winter holiday. Since 2015, I've engaged in a ritual of reflection and intention that's dear to me: **choosing a word to serve as my grounding for the upcoming year.**

I begin this practice by reflecting on my words of prior years: *Joy. Embrace. Explore. Delight. Authenticity. Roots. Blossom.* Over time, my memories become infused with the spirit and the vibe of the word I chose for that year. For example, last year I chose *blossom* as my word for 2022—and over the past year I can recall thinking of how I was blossoming into a more fully realized version of myself.

The next part of my ritual involves taking stock of different threads happening in my life, and thinking about my hopes for the upcoming year. I narrow them down into one feeling, and try to put a word to that feeling.

One of the things most on my mind—and something I love most about Unitarian Universalism—is our denominational commitment to periodically assessing our beliefs and discerning whether they should evolve....I'm proud to belong to a living religious tradition that embraces evolution, both scientifically and spiritually.

But deeply personal elements inform my ritual, too. In December, my sole surviving grandparent passed away. She was the last member of that generation in my family, and with her passing I've matured—no, *evolved*—to a new stage of life. It feels right for me to meditate on evolution this upcoming year.

Evolve is clearly my word for 2023. Change can be scary. But evolution is exciting. How am I going to evolve to meet the challenges of this new era we live in?

What's the word you want to reflect on during the upcoming year? What's the one word you want to remember your next year by?

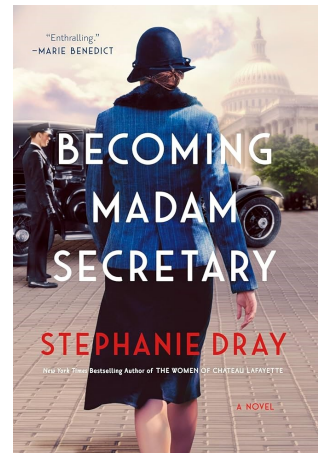

Ways to give to GNH

GNH is grateful for all those who have kept up with their pledges during the pandemic and days of virtual services.

As you know, there are several ways to give of your financial resources to GNH:

- Mail a check to GNH.
 - Ask your bank or credit union to mail a monthly check automatically. Many banks do not charge fees for this service. Check with your bank.
 - Set up monthly or quarterly automatic payments from your investment accounts. Talk to your financial adviser.
- ◇ Use our online giving app, Givelify. Set up your personal confidential account at <https://giv.li/phv85g>. Download the Givelify app to your smartphone using the Apple Store or Google Play. Once you have the app, donating to GNH is as easy as Tap. Give. Done. (Note that Givelify charges GNH a transaction fee of 2.9% on each transaction, so you may want to increase your online donation by a small percentage to compensate.)

NEWSLETTER POLICY (September 2008)

All items that appear in the Harbinger should be of general interest to the members and friends of GNH and be consistent with GNH's mission, purposes, and policies.

Newsletter submission should be as brief as possible, with a 500 word maximum. The editor has the right and responsibility to edit as needed to ensure conciseness and readability. The editor also has the right to delay publishing non-time-critical articles as available space may require.

The newsletter editor may refuse publication if a submission is considered inappropriate.

The editor shall consult with the minister and the Trustee who holds the communication portfolio for guidance in what shall be published.

Members of GNH shall have the choice to receive the Harbinger electronically or via paper mail. The newsletter shall be posted on the website. Do not submit names or contact information without the consent of other persons.
